Cyprus Museum

The Cyprus Museum will be open from 8 am until 4 pm and entry will be free.

Educational activities will be organised by the staff of the Cyprus Museum for students from Faneromeni Primary School (Educational Priority Zone), Nicosia. These activities will take place in the Museum gardens where students will be able to participate in the process of pottery-making, the making of replicas, pottery conservation as well as the crafting of jewellery inspired by original objects on exhibition in the Cyprus Museum.

In addition, special guided tours will be organised for visitors with impaired vision (for reservations: 22865807).

In Rooms IV, VIII and XII of the Cyprus Museum there will be viewings of documentaries on the history and archaeology of Cyprus.
